ORDER

This [REDACTED], 2018, came the Attorney for the Commonwealth and the defendant, [REDACTED] (DOB: [REDACTED]) who stands indicted for a felony, to-wit: Count One: Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer And Count Two: Prevent Law Enforcement Officer from Arresting the accused, who appeared in Court according to the conditions of his recognizance and came also Kimberly Stover and [REDACTED], his attorneys.

Whereupon, the accused was arraigned and after private consultation with his said attorneys pleaded NOT GUILTY to Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer and pleaded NOT GUILTY to Prevent Law Enforcement Officer from Arresting the accused, as charged in the indictment

The Court then impaneled thirty qualified jurors, free from exception for the trial of the defendant, in the manner provided by law.

Whereupon, the Attorney for the Commonwealth and the attorneys for the defendant each alternately exercised their rights to strike the names of eighteen venireman from the panel, as provided by law, and the remaining twelve jurors, constituting the jury for the trial of the defendant, were duly sworn.

After opening statements, the Court and jury heard the evidence presented by the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth presented a motion to dismiss both counts of the indictment, said motion was granted.

It is ORDERED that this case against the defendant shall be and hereby is dismissed.

The Court certifies that at all times during the trial of this case the defendant was personally present and his attorneys were likewise personally present and capably represented the defendant.

And the defendant was allowed to depart.
